An Offering of Thanksgiving

The Samaritan Car Care Clinic held a Ground Breaking Ceremony for the Covington shop location on a rather chilly April 19, 2022. Our ribbon cutting ceremony is scheduled for exactly one year later - April 19, 2023. The dream of building a nonprofit vehicle repair shop couldn't have become a reality without a physical location.

In December 2021, Corporex and Bill Butler donated the land that the soon-to-be-ready building sits upon. That incredible gift literally paved the way for the Clinic to work out of our own shop helping low-income families stay on their path to selfsufficiency.

There are so many partners to thank (see a listing in the next newsletter). For now, special thanks to the Catalytic Development Funding Corp. for financing the construction of the region's first non-profit vehicle repair shop. Without the loan from the Catalytic Fund, the Clinic's shop would not exist.

Because of your support, in the first guarter of 2023 the Clinic was able to help 67 families with shared cost car repairs. Just over 70% were female headed households, and just under 40% were ethnic minorities. The Clinic always has more requests for help than we can cover, so we stretch donations as much as we can to address the need.

I remain confident that the Samaritan Car Care Clinic will receive the funding needed to help clients of our referral partners stay on their road to financial independence. Thank you for your support!


The 2023 Business Impact Awards will take place on Wednesday, May 3rd. The winner in each category will be announced at the event. — Brent Cooper, NKY Chamber
