Samaritan Car Care Clinic 1428 Madison Avenue Covington, Kentucky 41011 That does NOT mean I am not thankful. That is actually the purpose of this quarter's note. Every day when I see the Samaritan Car Care Clinic shop in Covington I offer thanks. For people more recently connected with the Clinic, you may not know that the physical location began as a gift of a vacant lot from Corporex in December 2021. No building on the lot, just gravel and outlines of where the buildings had once been many decades ago.

But with a blank canvas, much can be done. So the next thank you goes to ATA Beilharz Architects in downtown Cincinnati. ATA Beilharz donated hundreds of hours of time to design the building we now have, working patiently with the City of Covington on design and material finishes.

Corporex did the Clinic another huge favor and drafted Luke Woerner to serve as a construction manager. Another wonderful inkind gift.

And the building would not have been built at all without loan financing from the Catalytic Development Fund in Covington. The principals at the Catalytic Development Fund understood there was a critical unmet need – no single agency was trying to address transportation barriers. The Catalytic Development Fund made a bold statement and loaned the Clinic the funds necessary to build the first dedicated non-profit vehicle repair shop in Northern KY. (sidebar: the Clinic owes more than \$400,000 on our mortgage, so any extra donations toward the loan would be fantastic!)

I definitely have an abundance of gratitude. Not just for those mentioned above, but for all of the supporters and donors who make sure the Samaritan Car Care Clinic can help as many low-income families as possible. We began as a group of volunteers in 2007. This August we celebrate the two-year anniversary of operating out of our own shop. Quite a ride it has been! — Bruce Kintner, Director

Carol Hartlaub and her team worked on the vetting and microloan process, and the SCCC did the necessary repairs on a Dodge Caravan donated to the Clinic.

It took several extra weeks to get insurance in place, sadly, a very common problem faced by SVdPNKY neighbors and most people referred to the Clinic.

Jamie is a single mom in the Ready to Work program at Gateway Community and Technical College, and has struggled to find affordable transportation. With multiple children the extra space in the van is, in Jamie's own words, "fantastic."

That is when Be Concerned contacted the Clinic.

It is rare for the Clinic to receive a donated truck of any kind. But in a providential way, the Clinic received an older Chevy work truck just weeks before Be Concerned reached out. After brake and suspension work, Brad was able to return to work!
