### From the Director's Chair . . . *Celebrating Anniversaries*

**A**ny business, whether a for-profit, or a not-for-profit in the case of the Samaritan Car Care Clinic, hopefully survives and thrives long enough to celebrate milestones.

The Clinic began with a group of volunteers doing oil changes on weekends back in 2007. There's nothing

overly special about celebrating an 18th anniversary, but it does surprise people who are less familiar with the Clinic's history to know that, yes, the Clinic has been offering a hand-up to families for many years!

A notable anniversary relates to the Clinic's official birthday. The Samaritan Car Care Clinic became a registered 501(c)(3) charitable institution in 2020, so 2025 represented the fifth official year for the Clinic. 18 years in practice, but 5 years in the eyes of the IRS.

The Clinic would not have its physical presence without help from two other supporters that celebrated major milestones in 2025. Bill Butler founded Corporex in 1965. His goal? Changing skylines, changing lives. Yes, you did the math correctly. Corporex just celebrated its 60th anniversary.



Had Bill Butler not followed his entrepreneurial dream, Corporex would not have grown to be the major developer it is today, and Corporex would not have been able to donate a vacant lot in Covington to the Clinic. That transformative gift was done at the end of 2021. "Thank You" just doesn't seem adequate.

The Clinic now had land, but how about a building where cars could be repaired, offering a hand-up to low-income families?

Enter The Catalytic Fund, Northern Kentucky's amazing non-profit lender for real estate development that celebrated its 10th anniversary in 2025.



In early 2022, Clinic Director Bruce Kintner met with Jeanne Schroer, the President and CEO of The Catalytic Fund. Fortunately, Jeanne immediately embraced the vision of helping create the first and only not-for-profit vehicle repair shop in NKY. That is how the Clinic was able to borrow the money needed to build the Samaritan Car Care Clinic's actual shop. Had The Catalytic Fund not addressed an unmet need for community oriented real estate projects, then the Samaritan Car Care Clinic couldn't be addressing the unmet need of reducing transportation barriers for low-income families. Again, "Thank You" just doesn't seem adequate.

The interconnected ties go much further than just with Corporex and The Catalytic Fund, because it is your continued support that makes what we do possible. The Clinic helped 353 families address transportation barriers in 2024, and I am pleased to share that we helped 389 families in 2025. Can't wait to celebrate more anniversaries!

## Making A Difference... One Repair At A Time

One of the most frequently requested car repairs from our referral partners deals with brakes. Earlier in October 2025, St. Vincent de Paul of NKY referred a young lady to the Samaritan Car Care Clinic who desperately needed brake work. She spent all of her savings buying a used car, and did not have any more funds to deal with severely worn brakes on that car. With no additional money and no ability to put repairs on a credit card, she just kept driving with the terribly worn brakes.

The photo to the right doesn't do complete justice to the situation, but all four brake rotors on her car were severely worn and grooved because the brake pads were essentially gone. Mechanics refer to this as "metal-on-metal." Like a hockey puck sliding along ice. The photo shows one of the rotors and the brake pads the Clinic took off of her car, next to a new rotor and new pads. Quite the contrast!



So a reminder that if you ever hear a squeal from your brakes, or it takes extra-long to come to a stop, get your brakes inspected very soon. Don't keep driving until they fail, as they did with this vehicle.

Your financial support helped make this woman's car safe for her, her family, and for you and me who share the same roads.

## Thank You Bishop Brossart Students


